

Why We Are Unable to “Ship”

While UPS will transport most of the smaller items we offer, the polycarbonate sheets we sell (even the smallest ones) are too large (dimensionally) for them to carry. The only way these rigid polycarbonate sheets can safely be transported is by LTL (Less-Than-Truckload) motor freight lines (trucks). In order for that to happen the material must be stacked and strapped onto heavy wooden pallets to protect them from in-transit damage. We have no ability to either construct or handle these heavy wooden pallets as we have neither a dock nor a forklift. That, compounded with the fact that most customers also don't have forklifts or docks to off-load these pallets from the truck, makes shipping the material impossible for us. We DO offer a local delivery service for destinations within 150 miles of our Wildwood warehouse, but the only other alternative is for customers to travel to our facility with vehicles capable of holding the largest sheets being ordered and receiving them at our warehouse.

Customers placing LARGE orders (20 or more full sheets) MAY be eligible to have their polycarbonate shipped directly to them from the factory in Wisconsin. LTL freight charges from Wisconsin can be fairly high, but we (since we are not using any of our own inventory) typically contribute a portion of that cost in the form of a discount. If your request for quote is for a substantial quantity of full sheets and you are outside of our 150 mile local delivery radius, your quote will be prepared as a drop-ship when returned to you.
